Solar Energy Systems – SEQR

Motion By _____ Seconded By _____

WHEREAS, the Wheatfield Town Code contains and specifies the local laws, and ordinances of the Town of Wheatfield; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wheatfield has observed that the Wheatfield local law that regulates the siting of solar energy systems in the Town is outdated and does not address the issues in the Wheatfield Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Town, through a Solar Committee and the Town’s consultant, has drafted an updated Solar Energy System Law and that draft law was presented to the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Part 617 of the implementing regulations pertaining to Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review Act - SEQRA) of the Environmental Conservation Law, the Wheatfield Town Board has conducted a coordinated environmental review of these Code revisions and has established itself as SEQR Lead Agency and has received no objections to acting as Lead Agency; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held regarding these Code amendments on 7/12/21 and comments were received from Town departments and the committee, and the Niagara County Planning Board referral was completed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Municipal Home Rule, the Town Board is proposing to adopt these revisions by enacting text amendments to the Code of the Town of Wheatfield.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that The Town of Wheatfield Town Board, in accordance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) has determined that the proposed amendments to the Town Code (see attached copies) of the Town of Wheatfield Code of Ordinances, will not adversely affect the natural resources of the State and/or the health, safety, and welfare of the public and is consistent with social and economic considerations and, therefore, issues a SEQRA Negative Declaration in accordance with Section 617.7 of the SEQRA regulations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Supervisor is authorized to sign the Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF Parts 1, 2 &3), which will act as the Negative Declaration, and that the required notifications be completed.

Solar Energy Systems – Adoption

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Wheatfield has determined that the Wheatfield Local Law regulating Solar Energy Systems is outdated, inadequate and fails to address the issues of the Wheatfield Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, through a Solar Committee, the Town’s consultant, and Town Attorney, has prepared an updated Solar Energy Systems Law, identified as Town of Wheatfield Local Law No. 4 – 2021, amending the Town of Wheatfield Zoning Ordinance by replacing Article XIX with a new Article XIX, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly held on July 12, 2021, receiving the comments of the public and all other interested parties; and

WHEREAS, the prepared Local Law No. 4 – 2021 was duly referred to the Niagara County Planning Board in accordance with New York State GML Section 239 m with the prepared Local Law No. 1 – 2021 being duly approved; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wheatfield Town Board, acting as SEQR Lead Agency, has issued a SEQR Negative Declaration; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law, the Town Board proposes the adoption of Local Law No. 4 – 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Wheatfield Town Board hereby adopts Local Law No. 4 – 2021, amending the Town of Wheatfield Zoning Ordinance, as presented therein, and providing for the regulation of Solar Energy Systems within the Town of Wheatfield.

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge in the Town of Wheatfield was closed by Niagara County Highway Department over 3 years ago, and

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge was actively used as a Bridge in Bergholz for over 100 years before it's closure, and

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge closure causes many hardships for the residents of the Town of Wheatfield and negatively affects public safety in the Town of Wheatfield, and

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge closure may cause delays for Ambulance response by the detour created by the Niagara County Highway Department, and

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge closure may cause delays for Fire Department response by the detour created by the Niagara County Highway Department, and

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge closure hinders the Wheatfield Highway Department's snow removal, leaf pickup and tree limb/brush chipping creating a dangerous situation by not being able to allow Town vehicles to backup safely, and

WHEREAS, the Hunt Street Bridge closure creates a dead-end street situation making School Bus usage impossible because they cannot back up,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

that the Town of Wheatfield Board hereby supports the residents of Bergholz, in the Town of Wheatfield, and supports the request to re-open the Hunt Street Bridge and further requests the County of Niagara to Take whatever steps necessary to make said reopening occur.
